GOLDEN VILLAGE HOSTS ANNUAL LOVE & PRIDE FILM FESTIVAL AT GV GRAND, GREAT WORLD CITY

Rising Asian star Tom Price to make a special appearance at the Opening Gala

Singapore, 11 October 2011 – Golden Village is proud to present the annual **Love & Pride Film Festival (LPFF)** which will be hosted exclusively at GV Grand, Great World City from 18th to 23rd October 2011. This year will mark the fourth year that the cinema chain is showcasing the LPFF since its 2008 inception.

The 2011 LPFF's line-up of films will comprise uncut, unedited Asian films **PERMANENT RESIDENCE** and **AMPHETAMINE** in Cantonese. Celebrating love in films from around the world with pride, the 2011 LPFF will kick off on 18th October with an opening gala reception at GV Grand, Great World City. Emerging new star and Hong Kong actor Tom Price, who starred in the recently released Steven Soderbergh's 2011 American medical thriller CONTAGION and the popular Taiwanese idol drama series LOVE YOU, will be making a special appearance at the event.

Tom Price, who plays the second lead role in **AMPHETAMINE**, will be speaking at the LPFF question and answer session hosted by talented home grown filmmaker, Boo Junfeng. The actor will share his thoughts and experience in his first breakout role that earned him a nomination for the Best New Performer at the 2010 Hong Kong Film Awards. LPFF will close with the film AMPHETAMINE. Festival ticketholders will also enjoy 15% off all ala carte menu items when they dine at Bangkok Jam and Pronto restaurants located at Great World City.

PERMANENT RESIDENCE: The film explores, in complete abandon and full nudity, the life story of a young man who pursues an impossible love with his straight boyfriend and contemplates on the mortality of his loved ones. Permanent Residence exudes a deep understanding and sensibility towards the important issues involved in loving, living and dying.

THE KIDS ARE ALRIGHT: Nic and Jules (Annette Bening and Julianne Moore) are married and share a cozy suburban Southern California home with their teenage children, Joni and Laser (Mia Wasikowska and Josh Hutcherson). Nic and Jules - or, when referred to jointly by Joni, "Moms" - gave birth to and raised their children, and built a family life for the four of them. As Joni prepares to leave for college, 15-year-old Laser presses her for a big favor. He wants Joni, now 18, to help him find their biological father; the two teenagers were conceived by artificial insemination. Against her better judgment, Joni honors her brother's request and manages to make contact with "bio-dad" Paul (Mark Ruffalo), an easygoing restaurateur. The kids find themselves drawn to the confirmed bachelor's footloose style - especially in contrast to Nic, a principled doctor who has long established their house rules. Jules, who has been looking to start a new career in landscaping, also strikes up a rapport with Paul.

As Paul comes into the lives of the forthright four, an unexpected new chapter begins for them as family ties are defined, re-defined, and then re-re-defined.

I LOVE YOU PHILLIPS MORRIS: Steven Russell is happily married to Debbie, and a member of the local police force when a car accident provokes a dramatic reassessment of his life. Steven becomes open about his homosexuality and decides to live life to the fullest - even if it means breaking the law. Steven's new, extravagant lifestyle involves cons and fraud and, eventually, a stay in the State Penitentiary where he meets sensitive, soft-spoken Phillip Morris. His devotion to freeing Phillip from jail and building the perfect life together prompts Steven to attempt and often succeed at one impossible con after another.

AMPHETAMINE: Openly gay banker Daniel debates whether to return to Australia or stay in Hong Kong when he meets Kafka, a straight swimming instructor. The young men fall in love, believing that their love can bridge anything, despite their difference in sexuality and Kafka's increasing drug use. Daniel does not regret his love for Kafka, who tries to love him back against his nature. But a flashback memory from Kafka's past makes it difficult for their relationship to work.
